Lesson 1 The Trinity

God

God is Spirit, He is a personal being without flesh and blood and therefore invisible (John 4:24). God dwells in heaven and is seated on a throne, yet He inhabits the whole earth. We cannot hide from God; His eyes see everything. We cannot escape God because he is everywhere all the time (Isa. 66: 1) God is LIMITLESS. He is bigger than the entire universe, larger than we could **even** imagine, He is immeasurable (Isa.40:12-15).

God has no origin. Origin is a word that can apply only to things that have been created. God is self-existent, self-dependent and self-sufficient. He existed before time began. He is the beginning and the end, the Alpha and Omega, the first and the last. (Ps 90:1, 2).

God has many attributes such as:

Eternal: Everlasting, He has lived in all our yesterdays and will live in all of our tomorrows and is still a right now God. (Isa. 46:9, 10)

Unchangeable: Unaffected by time or circumstances. (Mal.3:6)

Omnipotent: Almighty, all powerful. (Ps. 62:11)

Omniscient: All knowing (Ps: 139:4).

Omnipresent: Present everywhere; unlimited by space. (Jer. 23:24)

Holy: Sinless and hating sin; absolutely pure. (Lev. 19:2)

Just: Being fair and impartial. Truth is the basis of His righteousness (Deut.3:4)

Faithful: Keeping His promises, absolutely trustworthy. (II Tim. 2: 13)

Benevolent: Good, kind, desiring that we be well. (Ps. 145:9)

Merciful: Full of pity. (EX. 34:6, 7)

Infinite: Limitless, knowing no bounds in power, time, or space. (Rom. 11:33)

Love: He is our Father, confidant, and friend. We walk together and enjoy close fellowship. (I John 4:18)

Jesus Christ

Jesus Christ is the founder of the Christian belief. His birth, life, death and resurrection made history. His sinless life and moral teachings have made such an impact on the world that the measurement of time on earth is counted before (B.C.) and after (A.D) his birth.

Jesus was conceived and made flesh by the power of the Holy Spirit in the womb of a Jewish virgin girl named Mary. (Luke 1:35) Joseph was his foster-father, because Jesus did not have a human father. (Matt 13:55, 56) God entered into humanity to bring about the second creation, a second man without the original sin of the first man, Adam. The Holy Spirit brought about His conception in the virgin girl without the intervention of the normal reproductive cycle of man and woman. As a result of Christ's conception and birth He has two natures, divine and human. (Is. 9:6).

Many unusual events marked his birth for instance an angel announced Him before He was conceived. (Luke 1:26-38)

Jesus was born in a stable in Bethlehem and laid in a manger. (Luke2:4-7)

Angels announced his actual birth. (Luke 2:8-20)

Simeon and Anna recognized Him as the promised Messiah (Luke2:21-38) Wise men from the

Orient came to worship the infant King. (Matt. 2:1-12) King Herod tried to kill the infant King

Jesus. (Matt. 2:13-18)

Jesus was the promised "seed of David"; the King of the Jews that would occupy David's throne forever. As a descendant of King David both on Mary's and Joseph's side of the family Jesus was truly heir to King David's throne. Jesus also fulfilled the prophecy about the King of Israel when He made His entrance into Jerusalem, (John 12: 15)

Jesus Christ came to earth to introduce the Kingdom of God, redeem mankind from eternal damnation by destroying the works of the enemy (Satan) and restore man's fellowship with God. (Mark 1:14-15)

Jesus began His earthly ministry by preaching the Gospel of the Kingdom. He demonstrated its power by forgiving sins, healing the sick, raising the dead and casting out demons. (Matt. 11:4, 5) When we hear the word of God, believe the word of God and voluntarily submit our lives to God, the new birth happens, and we become new creations. We actually become "Born Again" when we receive Jesus' sacrificial death as a cleansing from sin, make Jesus the Lord of our human spirit, and receive the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. This new birth re-creates the spirit of our mind and joins us with God's Spirit, thereby enabling us to have the spiritual vision necessary to see and enter the Kingdom of God. (John 3:3-5)

As Jesus claimed to be the Son of God and allowed Himself to be worshipped as God. The Jews demanded that He be crucified because the Law of Moses condemned men to death if they made claim to deity. It was considered blasphemy against God. (John 19" chapter)

The Resurrection Story can be found in St.. John 20.

We believe that Jesus Christ is God manifested in the flesh because the Word says He is.

Divine Names: John. 20:28, Divine Attributes: Eternal (John 1:1, 2), Unchangeable (Heb. 13:8), Omnipresent (Matt. 28:20), Omniscient (Matt. 28:18), Divine Works (Heb. I:3), Divine Honor and Glory (John 5:23), (Heb. 1:6)

The Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Holy Trinity, true God with the Father and the Son. He is the out-breathing of God, that is, the life of God going forth to quicken (make alive).

Some of the symbols for the Holy Ghost are wind, power, fire, oil, water, a dove, a voice, rain, dew and a seal. (Matt 28:19)

We believe that the Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity because of what the Word says about Him.

He is called "God" and "Lord" (Acts5:3,4)

He does divine work: Creation (Ps.33:6)

The Holy Spirit performs mighty acts. He strives with sinners to bring them to God, by bringing. conviction of sin and convincing them to repent. (Gen 6:3)

He regenerates men to make them new creatures, baptizes them into the Body of Christ and indwells and fills them with Himself. (John 3:3-6)

The Holy Spirit is "Power" when He comes, we are endowed with power and evidence of that power. (Acts 1:8)

Jesus Christ lived His life in absolute dependence upon and in subjection to God the Father and to the Holy Spirit. He was conceived by the Holy Spirit in the virgin, Mary. During His earthly life He was anointed, led, filled and empowered by the Holy Spirit. The work of redemption and resurrection were accomplished by the Spirit of Holiness so Christ could bestow the gift of the Holy Spirit on his followers. (Acts 10:38)

The Holy Spirit is not an "it" we should regard Him as a real person, indeed, as Jesus Christ. We should hold Hirn in high esteem as loving, wise and strong, one worthy of our confidence, love, and surrender. He has been sent to us to be to us what Jesus Christ was to the disciples during the days of His personal companionship with them. We should strive to commune and fellowship of the Holy Spirit. (Eph. 4:30)

It is important to understand that when you reject spiritual understanding and attribute God's mighty works to Satan it is called blasphemy and is an unforgivable sin. Without the presence of the Holy Spirit, it is impossible for man to approach the throne of grace to find repentance for sin. Blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is unforgiveable because the Holy Spirit departs from the man/woman who blasphemes His name. Always know that The Holy Spirit loves us and leads us so we should always be mindful of Him and careful not to grieve Him.

We believe in the Holy Trinity (Godhead, Col. 2:9) which is the tri-unity of three divine and distinct identities: The Father, The Son and The Holy Ghost (Spirit). These three are One God. (I John5:7)

Although the mystery of the Holy Trinity is beyond human comprehension, we can gain a satisfactory understanding of this mystery through the Word of God and with the help of the Holy Spirit. All three identities are of the same substance, Spirit and they work together in unity. (I Tim. 3:16)

Lesson 2 Praise and Worship

It is through Praise and Worship that we minister to God, creating a spiritual dwelling place (atmosphere) for Him, that welcomes Him to come down and minister to us. This can also be called a holy habitation (Eph. 2:21-22).

Praise

We learn to praise the Lord as we join others in blending our voices in a great chorus of praise to God (Col. 3:16). Praise is how we present our bodies to God (Rom. 12:1). We express praise **by** lifting our hands (Ps 63:3-4), clapping our hands (Ps 47:1), singing (Ps 68:4), playing musical instruments and dancing (Ps 150:4-5), rejoicing and laughing (Phil 4:4), shouting with cries of victory (Is 12: 6) and lastly, we praise through our Giving (Luke 21:1-4).

Hebrew Words of Praise:

Yadah: To lift hands in surrender.

Halal: To shine, boast, to praise, dance

Shabach: A loud adoration, shout

Towdah: To worship with extended hands.

Barak: To kneel or bow an act of adoration.

Zamar: To sing praises with music

Worship

Worship is the purest form of adoration that we can offer God. In the Greek language, to worship means "to kiss". We cannot truly worship God without having a relationship with Hirn because worship is spirit to spirit. Worship is initiated in by the Holy Spirit. Worship is us giving glory to God just because He is God our Creator, because He is Jehovah Jireh our Provider, Jehovah Raphe the Lord that heals us and He is the Great I AM. Our worship belongs to God and God Alone (John 4:23, 24).

Worshipping in Spirit and in truth means that we give ourselves to God in faith with a sincere desire to bless Him, the Holy Spirit makes His presence real to us and gives us the ability to express our love for God directly (Ps 103:1). Oftentimes in worship we lift our hands in surrender to God or we may bow down in the presence of God. There may be times when we kneel or lay prostrate on our faces in God's presence. Being sincere in our worship is a very intimate and unique experience.

The natural man cannot please God, so He has given us the gift of the Holy Spirit as evidenced by speaking in tongues which is our spiritual language. When we sing with fervor to God in our spiritual or heavenly language, we gain entry into his holy presence where we are free to give ourselves wholly to Him in worship (Rom. 8:6-8 and I Cor. 2:14).

Tithes and Offering Lesson 3

Tithe

A tithe is a tenth part (10%). It is the portion of what we have that belongs to God it's what we owe Him. (Lev.7:30). Tithing began with Abraham who gave a tenth of the spoils of victory to Melchizadek, a **priest** of God (Gen. 14:18-20). Abraham tithed because he had seen that God owned everything and had blessed him with abundance. Through his giving, Abraham told God that he trusted Him alone to provide for him. (Gen. 14:19, 20) God has promised every kind of prosperity to those who are obedient in their giving. (Mal. 3: 10, 11)

When we give it is imperative that we give with joy because we love God and want to be obedient. Be excited to give! Our attitude determines whether or not God will receive our gift. Giving is a principle, meaning if you are a sower and God has blessed you with seed, planting that seed in good ground will cause you to reap a good harvest. That which you sow (good or bad) you will also reap. If we sow sparingly, we will reap sparingly. (II Cor. 9:6)

Offering

An offering is a gift to the work of God that is beyond the tithe. It is a free will contribution to support a special need or person or to express thanks.

Jesus taught that the most important part of giving is the attitude of our heart. He taught:

- a. Clinging to earthly wealth can make us lose out in eternal wealth. (Luke 12:33,34). b. We should not give expecting to be rewarded by men (Matt.6: 1).
- c. Giving is as much a part of serving God as prayer and fasting (Matt. 6:3,5,16).
- d. Our giving is the measure of what we can receive (Luke 6:38).

God wants us to give in ways which glorify Him and prepare us to receive more blessings from Him; therefore, we should give willingly, generously, gladly and simply (II Cor. 9:6,7). As we allow God to create generosity in our spirits, His promises to us are blessings, increase, health, a spiritual foundation for the future and fruits of righteousness (Prov. 11:24, 25).

We serve God by:

- 1. Regular attending church services.
- 2. Consistent in the giving of tithes and offerings to support the church and its ministries.
- 3. Praying regularly for the church leaders and members.
- 4. Using our natural and spiritual gifts for the growth and development of the church.
- 5. Showing charity and hospitality when and wherever needed.
- 6. Living a God-fearing life and striving to please God so that we honorably represent **Him** and our church.

When we give it is an act of worship. It becomes a ministry to God as we give of ourselves and our possessions for the advancement of the Kingdom of God here on earth. (II Cor. 8:4,5). When we present our bodies as a living sacrifice unto the Lord and serve others in love we are found pleasing in His sight (Rom. 12:1). When we commit to be a part of the Body of Christ the commitment is made to God first ourselves and family second and then to our ministry.

Lesson 4 Praying and Fasting

Prayer is how we communicate with God. We speak to Him orally or mentally, formally or informally (I Tim. 2:8). We talk directly to Him (Ps. 65:2). Our prayer is a form of worship because it's us acknowledging the sovereignty and power of God with thanksgiving (Phil. 4:6).

Jesus loves us so much that he gave us the Lord's Prayer (Matt. 6:9-13) as a basic pattern **for** prayer which is praying for the following things:

- To honor God's name.
- To see the Fatherhood of God and accept His will.
- To ask for our daily needs.
- To forgive so we may be forgiven.
- To ask for power to overcome evil forces.
- To ask for the demonstration of God's power in the earth. A method of personal prayer:
- a. To come into God's presence with praise and thanksgiving, inviting Him to meet with us for fellowship or hear our personal petitions. (Ps. 100:4).
- b. To yield ourselves to the Holy Spirit in worship and as our spirit responds to Him, we begin speaking mysteries to God in an unknown tongue (Rom. 8:26, 27).
- c. To meditate reverently in God's presence, listening, learning and rejoicing. During this time, the Holy Spirit may inspire a word of Scripture, or a word of comfort or instruction. (Ps. 19:14).
- d. To read the scriptures the Holy Spirit has inspired us and search out related Scriptures. (Acts 17:11).
- e. To leave the place of personal prayer renewed in spirit and in mind (Rom. 12:2). When we spend time in prayer, we receive the joy of having fellowship with the Lord, we receive understanding of His Word (Bible), comfort, guidance and power to overcome temptation. (Luke 22:46), (Jude 20 and 21).

Since we do not know how to pray, we pray in our heavenly language (speaking in tongues), the Holy Spirit who is in us, comes to our aid and through us He pleads with God on our behalf. The Holy Spirit who dwells in us knows our deep, personal needs and speaks to God about us. He uses a language foreign to us so that we won't be embarrassed or offended as He uncovers our sins, weaknesses and inadequacies openly to God in prayer (Rom. 8:26, I Cor. 14:2).

Praying in tongues is a means that God has given us to pray in the Spirit so that we may be perfected in holiness and built up in faith (Jude 20).

There are a few things that we should avoid in our prayer time:

- Vain repetitions. (saying the same prayer over and over again) (Matt. 6:7).
- Imposing our will above the will of God (Matt. 26:39).
- Bargaining with God (Luke 4:12).
- Seeking revenge (Matt. 5:44-46).

There are three kinds of fasts:

Regular: Refraining from all food and drink except water (Matt. 4:2).

Partial: Omitting a certain meal each day and strictly restricting the quantity of food and drink we normally consume (Dan. 10:3).

Complete: Not eating or drinking food or liquids of any kind. This as is not to exceed three days. (Acts 9:9).

*IMPORTANT: To ensure your health and safety, if you have any medical condition or take medication please check with your doctor before attempting to fast.

When fasting our main objective should be to minister to the Lord through worship and by giving ourselves wholly unto Him (Acts 13:2).

Fasting and praying can affect change in your life and in the lives of others. Living a life of prayer, holiness and obedience to God is how we develop a relationship with Him.

Benefits of Prayer and Fasting:

Breaks the bands of wickedness (Is. 58:6) Destroys yokes (Is. 10:27)

Brings Healing and Deliverance (James 5: 15) Strengthens us (Eph 3: 14-19)

Builds our faith (Jude 1:20) Produces results (James 5:16)

Lesson 5

The Sacraments of the Church

Sacraments ·

The word sacrament comes from the Latin language and means an oath of allegiance, consecration, or solemn obligation. The Christian Church uses the word to describe something sacred in character or significance: a spiritual sign, seal or bond (or a covenant held to exist between God and man.)

There are seven sacraments:

- 1. Water Baptism: the physical act of submerging into water. Spiritually represents the death and burial of the old man and resurrection of the new man. In the waters of baptism, you should experience a cutting away of the foreskin of your heart. The foreskin represents the removal of the enmity (hatred) that we were born with towards God. (Rom. 6:4)
- 2. The Lord's Supper: was instituted by Jesus Christ on the night before he died, that confirms the covenant made with God through the blood of Christ. It is a fulfillment of the eternal covenant of the Passover Feast which God commanded the Israelites to observe. Through the blood of the lamb, the Israelites confirmed their covenant with God. (I Co. 23-26)
- 3. Confirmation: allows Christians to be strengthened and established in the faith Jesus Christ. (Acts 14:21, 22)
- 4. Foot Washing: instituted by Jesus Christ to enable man to fulfill the law of God. It is a spiritual statement of humility and forgiveness. (Matt. 5: 17, 18), (John 13:8)
- 5. Matrimony: instituted by God through which a man and a woman enter into a lifetime agreement verbalizing vows (oaths) made to each other in the presence of God.
- 6. Presentation of a Child to God: when parents give their child to God for the purpose of having the Lord direct the spiritual growth and development of the child. (Matt. 19:14)
- 7. Anointing with Oil: It is written in the Scriptures for us to observe. It has an outward visible symbol, the olive oil (consecrated by prayer), and the inward working of forgiveness and restoration. (James 5:14-15)

Oil symbolized the presence of the Holy Spirit (Heb. 1:9). It is the symbol of the sacrament that secures the promised blessings of God. (Heb. 8:5).

The consecrated oils are smeared and rubbed or poured on the sick individual for healing and deliverance in the Name of Jesus. The anointed oil is administered by the elders of the Church. (James 5:14).

A sacrament has two parts:

- (a) The outward visible sign, act or ceremony that is observed exactly as it is taught in the scriptures.
- (b) The inward spiritual work of the Holy Spirit that imparts life and change.

The believer who prepares his heart and obeys in faith receives spiritual life and change through revelation and experience.

We prepare ourselves to receive a sacrament by repentance which is the recognizing and acknowledgment of our need (Acts 2:38).

We also prepare ourselves to receive a sacrament by allowing the Holy Spirit to give us an understanding of God's Word. (Rom. 10:17)

A Review of the Sacraments
